Difference b/w why Sass and Hari left w/o saying good-bye - abandonment

Using exactly 300 words, respond to this week's reading from the first person point of view. Refer to particular events or use quotes to connect your opinions, beliefs, and emotions to the reading with specificity. Use a red pen to self-edit. Type your final draft.

In this section of Homeless Bird, by Gloria Whelan, the theme that stands out is abandonment. Koly is left behind by her sass and is forced to live on her own. But this isn't the first or last time Koly is abandoned, and each abandonment evokes a different feeling in her. Koly was left by her family, Sass, and now Raji. Sass and Raji both left without saying goodbye, but I believe the reason behind why they did it are completely different. Sass obviously did it so she wouldn't be followed by Koly, but perhaps Sass didn't want to feel the guilt of facing Koly before she leaves her forever. While Sass left without saying good-bye for her own personal benefit, Raji did it because he thought he wasn't wanted. It is pretty obvious that Raji and Koly have feelings for each other, but neither of them know that the feeling is mutual. When Raji mentioned that he would want a wife when he returns to his village, Koly shows no sign that she wants that person to be her, even though she does. Raji assumes that Koly doesn't like him, so he sadly returns to his village without saying good-bye. Even though Raji and Sass leave her the same way, their abandonments are not the same because they effect Koly differently. Of course Sass leaving hurt Koly, but Koly could've expected Sass to do something like this, but not Raji. Even though Koly just recently met Raji, she felt a connection with him and it didn't seem like he would just disappear without telling her. Although he is gone, I believe Raji will return because unlike Sass, his abandoning of Koly was not planned.
