

Welcome to blackbird & Company's language arts program!

After exploring and familiarizing yourself with all of the materials included in your 2nd Grade Collection, it's time to map out the schedule of work for the year. We use "grade level" merely as a common reference point. Every student will fall individually across a range of levels in different subjects, and even within a single subject. Our materials are designed to be flexible for students and teachers, allowing for complete differentiation as needed. These elements can be staggered and/or spaced out in order to meet your particular needs, creating a varied and comprehensive learning experience that is best for your students.

As you look at your unique school schedule and students, be sure to block out any weeks that you will be off campus for holidays, field trips, in-service, testing or other activities. If your school adds in special days of crafts or activities surrounding holidays, be sure to take that into consideration as you look at each piece of curriculum and how it will best fit into your program with fluidity and continuity where required.

Things to Consider:

Calendar of Days runs throughout the entire school year. Monday through Friday, 15-20 minutes per day is all that is needed!

Earlybird Literature & Writing requires 28 weeks to complete. This is core and needs to take precedence in scheduling.

Taxonomy of Living Things: Introduction to Animals requires 13 weeks if the weekly layout of the Research Discovery Guide is followed. Each section in the Guide can stand on its own and is not dependent on work previously completed. If electing a twice per week schedule, work does not need to be assigned on consecutive days. Our Earlybird Taxonomy of Living Things Planner demonstrates a twice per week schedule with each session requiring approximately one hour. You can utilize a once per week longer block session or smaller daily bites to best accommodate your schedule and student needs.

Storymaker A: Farm Tales requires 30 weeks to complete but is utilized only once per week in a 45 minute session. This work can be broken up into smaller daily bites if preferable.

Operation Lexicon: Word Collecting requires 12 weeks to complete and needs only 15-30 minutes per day, 2 days per week. The segments can be done consecutively or broken up as in our Grade Level Collection Calendar.

The following sample schedule is provided as a tool to help you as you lay out your curriculum schedule for the year. Please make adjustments to cater this to your particular circumstances. Utilize our subject specific information for more detailed scheduling notes and information.



Sample Weekly Schedule:

This mock schedule is mapped out for a 5 day per week program. This format can be easily adapted to a 4 day per week program by adjusting the daily workload and times. Our schedule assumes a 40 week school year with ample room for activities, holidays, and fun. We will jump weeks at times when a static schedule has been demonstrated and pick it up where a new element is added into the schedule.

This same pattern will be utilized through the end of the year with Guides dropping off at different times:

Storymaker concludes on week 30.

Operation Lexicon has 7 more weeks to complete. These can be done consecutively or given a break between Book Units with The Boy Who Loved Words finishing on week 32 and The Word Collector being completed in weeks 37-40.

Taxonomy of Living Things will be completed on week 40.

Calendar of Days will run daily through the end of week 40.

This 40 week schedule represents about 9 months on the calendar, allowing for 175–180 days of instruction after accounting for breaks and holidays. The following is a suggested outline showing how the pieces of your Grade Level Collection can be puzzled together over the course of the school year. Any of the elements can be staggered and/or spread out in order to meet your particular needs, creating a varied and comprehensive learning experience.
